For Shriners Hospitals for Children — Greenville, this is a year of celebration. Not only do we celebrate our 90th Anniversary, along with the mission and vision that began all those decades ago, but we equally celebrate the accomplishments, milestones and victories that we have achieved in this new era.

This past year marked the addition of Dr. Lauren Hyer, the only female pediatric orthopaedic surgeon currently practicing in the state of South Carolina, and Dr. Brandon Green, our first physician to lead a daily clinic outside of our four walls at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Orthopaedics Clinic at Niswonger Children's Hospital in Johnson City, Tennessee.

Along with the successful launch of the Johnson City location, we also saw the grand openings of monthly clinics in Hendersonville, North Carolina and Anderson, South Carolina. These three clinics joined the existing clinic in Bluffton, South Carolina in supporting our devotion to bringing our expert care to the doorsteps of children in need.

The hard work of our staff was recognized by Press Ganey, an organization dedicated to supporting health care providers in understanding and improving the entire patient experience. Greenville Shriners Hospital received the Pinnacle of Excellence Award. This crowning achievement is presented to those elite hospitals that "maintain consistently high levels of excellence over multiple years in Inpatient Pediatric Care."

We continue to strive to bring our patients the very best – from upgrades to the state-of-the-art EOS imaging system that vastly reduces radiation for our patients who undergo frequent X-rays, to the addition of new equipment for our Rehabilitation Services and Surgical Services departments.

Ninety years is a long time. But at Greenville Shriners Hospital, we are just getting started.

Meet Conner

"Never give up on your dreams. Don't let anything get in your way" is the motto 15-year-old Conner Stroud embodies. Conner dreams of being a tennis star. Being born with Proximal Femoral Focal Deficiency (PFFD) in both legs, Conner could have been left sitting court side. PFFD is a condition where the end of the bone closest to the hip is too short, leaving Conner's feet attached to his legs without ankles, femurs or knees. After consulting with surgeons at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Greenville, his parents made the decision to have both legs amputated when he was just 2 years old.

Conner is currently ranked the #1 Junior Wheelchair Tennis Player in the United States! He is ranked #21 in the World!

Working Together to Change Lives

Shriners Hospitals for Children — Greenville's Clinics:

Satellite Office in Johnson City



Three years ago, we began a journey to bring the mission and expert care of Shriners Hospitals for Children — Greenville to more kids. It was uncharted territory for the hospital system as we set our sights on creating a first-of-its-kind pediatric orthopaedics practice outside of our four walls. We were determined to bring our services as close as possible to the door steps of families in need.

In October 2016, we officially reached our destination as we opened Shriners Hospitals for Children Orthopaedics Clinic at Niswonger Children's Hospital in Johnson City, Tennessee. Niswonger Children's Hospital is part of the Mountain State Health Alliance serving a 29-county area, largely consisting of rural communities in eastern Tennessee and western North Carolina.

The newest addition to our outstanding team of surgeons, Dr. Brandon Green, is at the helm of the clinic located in a medical office building adjacent to Niswonger Children's Hospital. Dr. Green not only sees patients on a daily basis in Tennessee but also performs surgeries in Johnson City.

Patients originating from the area who may best be served by another staff surgeon will be referred to our hospital in Greenville. Clinic patients may also come to Greenville for motion analysis studies or for care in one of our specialty clinics.

Outreach Clinics: Anderson, Bluffton, Hendersonville, and Greenwood

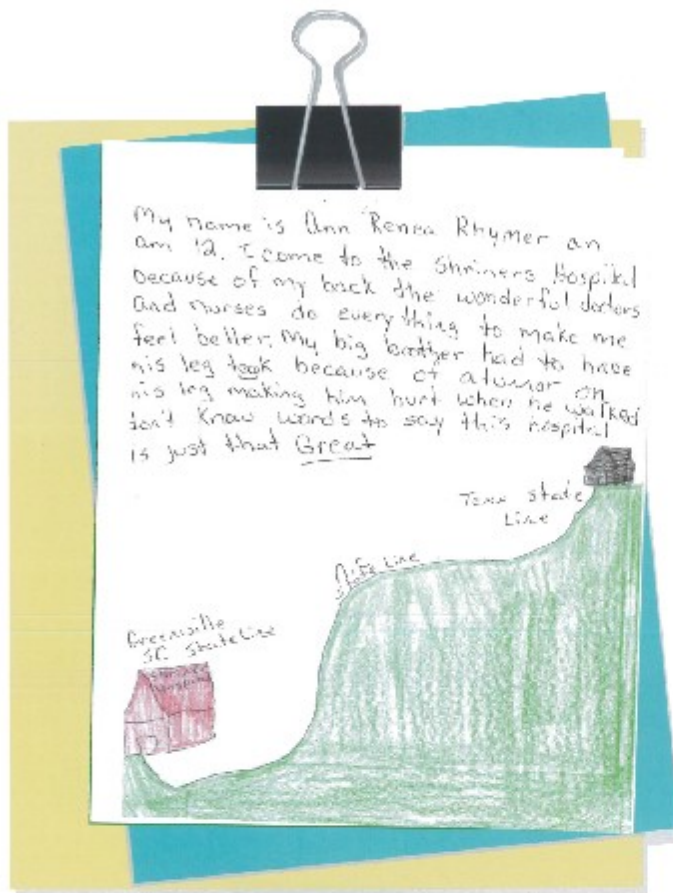
In our quest to bring our expert care to the "doorsteps of families in need," Shriners Hospitals for Children — Greenville has begun seeing patients at the new Shriners Hospitals for Children Orthopaedics Clinics in Anderson, Bluffton, Hendersonville, and Greenwood.

Our three newest clinics opened three years after we saw our first patients at our first satellite clinic in Bluffton, South Carolina. The Bluffton clinic continues to do well, and we feel confident that we are providing an excellent experience for Lowcountry patients who we would not otherwise see due to distance.

Ultimately, we believe these clinics will position us to increase the number of children in those areas who have access to our care.

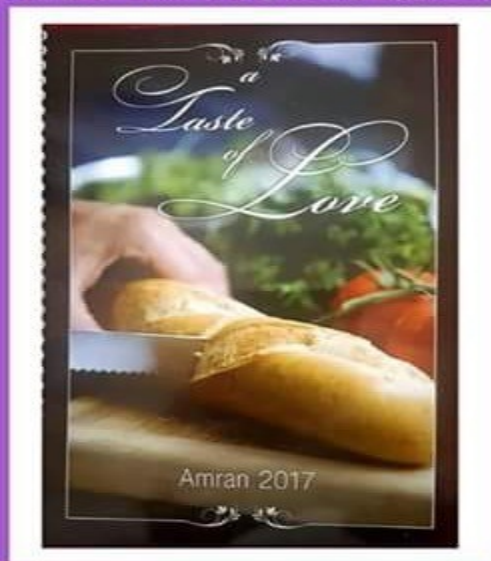

The 2016 Final Membership Numbers have now been confirmed. Shriners International began the new year with 244,330 – the first year since 1917 that we have started with *less* than 250,000. While we did witness some great new trends in membership development, the massive number of suspensions for non-payment of dues caused the largest decline. The net membership loss, overall, for 2016 was 4.93%.

A *tremendous* positive effect resulted from thinking “outside the box,” instituting new clubs and units and focusing resources on targeted communications to delinquent nobles who might have otherwise been suspended. Considering the fact that several temples increased their dues in conjunction with the per-capita increase, these extra efforts, as well as the increased collaboration between local temple leaders and the Shriners Headquarters team kept the suspensions in line with previous years, resulting in little to no effect from the increased per-capita and temple dues. This collaboration will continue throughout 2017, and it is anticipated that an even bigger impact will be felt in our year-end numbers.

How did Amran Temple fare? **Gold!**

Temples were recognized by the Membership Hall of Fame for their net accomplishments in membership development during 2016.

Bronze: (40 temples) Less than 2% improvement from 2015.

Silver: (36 temples) Greater than 2% improvement from 2015.

Gold: (22 temples) Achieved a net membership gain.

We recognize these temples for their improvement and membership success! And, we encourage all to recognize their hard work and share in our congratulations!
