A Message from the Hospitals

Virtual reality: Easing pain and providing comfort for patients

Shriners Hospitals for Children — Spokane patient Jose "Ricky" Pinto Duque sat nervously in a patient care room while waiting for an intravenous drip feed (IV). "I don't like needles at all, they make me nervous," said Ricky. The nurse picked up the phone and called Recreation Therapy Manager Carol Kaczka. Within minutes, Kaczka walked in with a large grey briefcase and pulled out a pair of large black goggles and noise-cancelling headphones. The next thing Ricky knew, he was floating around in the ocean with whales and tropical fish.

Ricky was using a KindVR headset, a new virtual reality non-pharmaceutical pain management tool used at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Spokane. "I liked it a lot. I barely noticed the needle going in. I really liked seeing the whales," said Ricky.

Virtual reality (VR), a computergenerated simulation, allows users to interact with an imaginary environment in a fully immersive experience. This therapeutic process can help reduce pain, anxiety or stress caused by medical procedures and conditions. Bryan Tompkins, M.D., of Shriners Hospitals for Children — Spokane, is working closely with the medical VR organization, KindVR, to carefully select gentle and safe VR programs that have the potential to transform pain management. "Having surgery, resetting a broken bone or starting an IV can be scary and painful for children. Virtual reality has been found to help children in these situations, using distraction to reduce pain and alleviate their fears. During these stressful situations, the patients, through the use of VR, enter a calm, imaginary world with fish, dolphins and treasure," said Dr. Tompkins.

West squad holds off East for win 21-17

Godwin and Hollins named Most Outstanding Players

In an entertaining game in which the West squad took an early lead and had to hold off a surging East team, the most outstanding players stood out among their fellow all-stars.

The E. Jack Spaulding Award for Most Outstanding Defensive Player was awarded to Oregon linebacker Justin Hollins of the West team. Hollins registered 10 tackles (9 solo), 2 sacks, and 3 tackles-for-loss in a highly disruptive afternoon.

The William H. Coffman Award for Most Outstanding Offensive Player went to Terry Godwin II, wide receiver out of the University of Georgia. Godwin scored 2 touchdowns for the East squad with four catches and 80 yards.

Imperial Potentate's Membership Referral Program:

Shriners International has developed a new approach to membership development, changing the membership paradigm with the introduction of a new referral program. With this new referral functionality, current nobles can now directly refer names of friends, family members and acquaintances who they feel would make good Shriners.

Similar to <u>beashrinernow.com</u>, this new referral program is administered through WebFez and links the prospect with his referring noble, promoting natural mentorship based on a pre-existing friendship or acquaintance. The new process can be tracked and reported, and each referral triggers automatic communications to the referrer and the prospect. Once a noble makes a referral, he then receives tools and resources to mentor his prospect to creation or restoration. The program encourages constant collaboration, so that

everyone can share their Shrine with the good men around them. To
